Members of the Chautauqua County Dept. of Planning and Development visited the Village of Sherman to see the economic and community development projects, hear from businesses, and participate in the Complete Streets Workshop. Their tour and discussion were intended to further familiarize themselves with Sherman, both our challenges and opportunities.

They heard why owners have chosen to invest in Sherman and what possibilities and vision there is for Sherman. As representatives and ambassadors of other related agencies i.e., CCPEG, CCIDA, CREDC, they have provided strong support of the NYMS project, granting the Village \$25,000 toward the Walkway Awning, and \$12,000 for the Complete Streets planning grant. They extended their support of these and other project initiatives, while offering future support for placemaking, gateways, restoration, trail development and tourist promotion.
